**KIRKINTILLOCH LINK ROAD
Residents' Briefing Note
on Proposed Scottish Water Works in the vicinity of Lindsaybeg Road**

As you may be aware the Preferred Contractor for the construction of the Kirkintilloch Link Road is currently carrying out preparatory works involving tree removal (now complete), Japanese knotweed treatment and public utility diversions.

Kirkintilloch's Initiative has, today, received notification that Scottish Water intend to have their Contractor (Alfred McAlpine) start work on Monday 12 May on the diversion of water mains in the Lindsaybeg Road area. Scottish Water has agreed with East Dunbartonshire Council Roads Service the working arrangements and traffic management to cover the next two weeks. This will involve temporary traffic control, in the form of 3-way traffic lights, being located at the junction of Lindsaybeg Road and Blacklands Place and will affect the only access to the Claddens Estate.

The agreement with the Council's Roads Service requires the Contractor to do everything in its power to minimise the delays associated with this work. Given the sensitive location it is inevitable that there will be a degree of inconvenience for those who need to access the Claddens Estate and other travellers on Lindsaybeg Road.

I apologise in advance for any difficulties this work may cause. Please be assured that the traffic management arrangements are essential to allow the work to be carried out safely and that the Contractor is required to complete the work as quickly as possible so as to minimise inconvenience to residents.
