**KIRKINTILLOCH LINK ROAD
NOTIFICATION OF NEARBY WORKS**

As part of the final approval process for the proposed Industry Street Bridge the coal authorities have requested that an investigative survey be carried out. This survey is required to prove the existence and condition of a coal seam which, although at a depth of up to 40 metres, could have an influence on the preparation of the foundations for the bridge.

From Monday 8 September 2008 for a period of approximately 1 week drilling work will take place in the railway cutting beneath the existing Industry Street Bridge. A specialist drilling rig will be used for this work. This rig will be lorry mounted and will be removed from the site each evening.

The rig will drill 4 holes to a depth of around 40 metres by rotating a drill bit into the ground. This process does not involve driving the drill bit into the ground by percussive means i.e. with a hammer. Noise levels are therefore expected to be modest. Little vibration is set up by this process. On completion of the survey the holes will be backfilled to ground level.

There will no impact on traffic or pedestrian use of Industry Street as a result of these survey works.
